HILL CLIMB CANCELLATION

Many of you who read the March-April issue of SPORTS CAR no doubt noticed the section on Contest Board Notes and Regulations. One of provisions of this section, a change to the Competition Regulations, makes it mandatory that all drivers in competition speed events, including regional hill climbs, be competition licence holders.

At the present time only one-sixth of our members have such licenses. Your officers feel that an event which could be entered by such a small percentage of the membership could not be staged for the enjoyment of all and consequently have cancelled the May Hill Climb. The date, May 4th, has been left open.

The October Hill Climb still remains on the calendar in the hope that we will have enough interested members who are competition license holders by that time to stage a successful event.
