We have two new members from Lincoln this month. Ted Schultz and Vic Kuklin. Welcome to the club!!!!

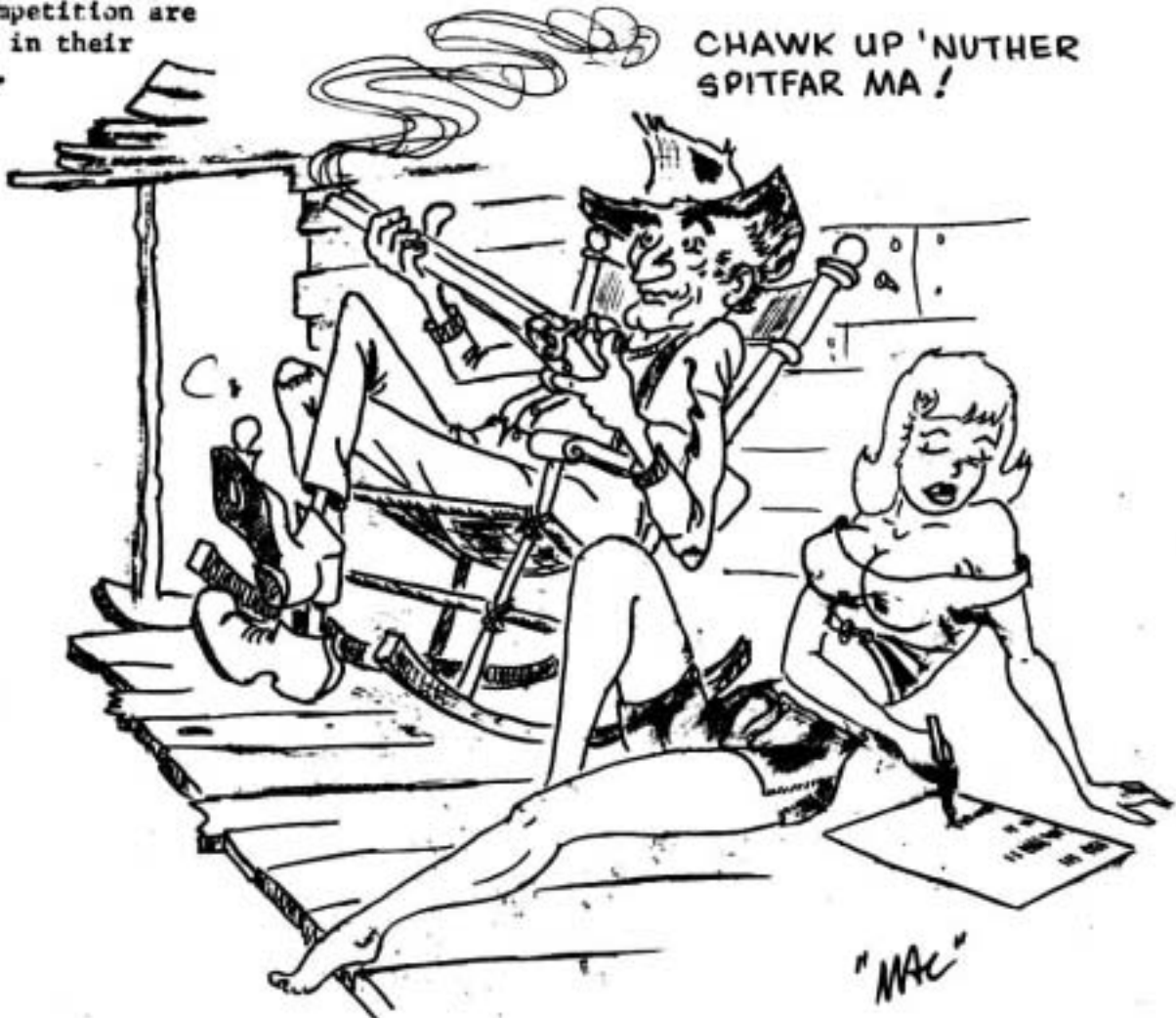
